CULTURAL GLOSSARY

Adlai Stevenson. Democratic candidate for president in 1952 and 1956, losing to Dwight D Eisenhower on both occasions. Died in 1965 at St Georges hospital when it was based at Hyde Park Corner

Arthur Treacher's. Chain of fish and chip shops named after an English character actor

Bengay. Deep Heat rub

Chubby Checker. Soul Singer, best known for popularising the Twist in the early 60s

The Gipper. Nickname of George Gipp, American Football Player, who died tragically young. Portrayed on the screen by Ronald Reagan who later used his deathbed line, "Win one for the Gipper", as a political slogan in the 80s

Gloria Steinem. Leader of the Women's Liberation Movement in 60s and 70s; born in Toledo Ohio in 1934

Our Gang. A series of comedy short films about a group of poor children and the adventures they had together

Paine Webber. Financial Services Company whose advertising slogan was "Thank you Paine Webber", uttered by Jimmy Connors among others

Saran Wrap. Cling Film

Stella D'Oro. Brand of cookies, inspired by Italian baking. Established in the Bronx in 1932, now owned by a conglomerate

Stouffers. Brand of frozen food

Vera Hruba Ralston. Czech figure skater who emigrated to the US in the early 40s and became a Hollywood actress. Married the studio head, which no doubt contributed to her success.
